given 50 points each. The students of Std. VI to VIII enacted a play based on the incident of kidnapping of Sita. 18 students performed under the guidance of Mrs. Seema Tiwari and Mrs. Balwant Kaur Gill. The play started with the scene where Mata Sita went to pluck the flowers and saw the magnificent golden deer. She pleaded Lord Rama to catch the deer for her without knowing that deer was a treacherous demon named Marich. His aim

amazed everyone with its great performance by highly talented students. This month the drama society presented an extract from the epic Ramayana and enacted the story of luv and Kush.

The little champs of 1st and 2nd standard presented a play on the wedding of lord Rama and Sita. Reporter Parneet Kaur (10-C) visited the venue. She reported that nearly 80 students were sitting as audience and 13-15 parents were also waiting there for the play to start.
